Actually, I would not have been surprised to find that more than nine were MIA because it was a PFF aircraft originally equipped with H2X radar (Mickey) successively in 482nd, 389th and 453rd BGs, that would have had two more crew members. Although it appears on the 492nd BG inventories as a B-24HSH (NITE), perhaps the H2X had been removed?

I notice that it had a nickname: CHIEF. Have you a photo of it showing the name and any nose art?
